Just a few reminders of control measures we have in place to reduce number of daily contacts.


All children and staff observed a one minute silence to pay their respects and laid their own poppies that had been painted onto pebbles outside the school grounds.

We will remember them.





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Holídays in Term Time

Our school attendance last year 96.2%. Our school increased to attendance target is 96%. This target is National Average and therefore now slightly above. Thankyou so much for you support. Ofsted evaluate school attendance and a low attendance can affect school's Ofsted judgements. We continue to see a large increase in requests for holidays in term time. Just to remind parents and carers that as of 1st September 2013, Head Teachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. Absence during term time should be avoided because children can fall behind with their work and may find it difficult to integrate. An application using the leave of absence form (available from the school office) for leave must be made in writing to the school Head Teacher, detailing the exceptional circumstances. The Head Teacher must be satisfied the circumstances warrant the granting of leave. If you do not apply for leave in advance, the absence will be PLEASE NOTE- NO AFTER SCHOOL recorded as unauthorised. You can be fined for taking your child on holiday during term time without consent from the school.
