Holidays in Term Time

school attendance last increased to 96.2%. Our school attendance target is 96%. This target is National Average and therefore now slightly above. Thankyou so much for you Ofsted evaluate attendance and a low attendance can affect school's Ofsted judgements. We continue to see a large increase in requests for holidays in term time. Just to remind parents and carers that as of 1st September 2013, Head Teachers may home. not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. Absence during term time should be avoided because children can fall behind with their work and may find it difficult to integrate. An application using the leave of absence form (available from the school office)

for leave must be made in writing to the Head Teacher, detailing the exceptional circumstances. The Head Teacher must be satisfied the circumstances warrant the granting of leave. If you do not apply for leave in advance, the absence will be recorded as unauthorised. You can be fined for taking your child on holiday during term time without consent from the school.

We regularly send texts/mail to parents with details of events happening in school or just reminders. Please notify school if you haven't received any texts/mail in the last month. Your contact details may need updating.

Loan of Devices to Support Home Learning

<u>Loan of Devices (Laptops) to</u> <u>Support Remote Learning</u>

As you may be aware the government has a scheme to provide laptops to children who do not have devices/internet access at home.

At the time of writing, Government guidance states that children who are eligible for this are those in Years 3-6 where any of the following are applicable:

- There are no digital devices in your household
- The only available device is a smartphone
- There is only one device in your household which is being shared with more than one other family member
- Your child is clinically extremely vulnerable and having to shield

If your child falls into any of the above categories, the school has been allocated a limited number of devices to loan to children in order for them to continue with their learning remotely from home.

These should be available shortly.

The scheme is a loan system. A laptop would be loaned to any eligible pupil for the duration of school closure. There will be a loan agreement to be signed and the laptop will have to be returned once school is re-opened.
