They met a magician who said he could make them rich.

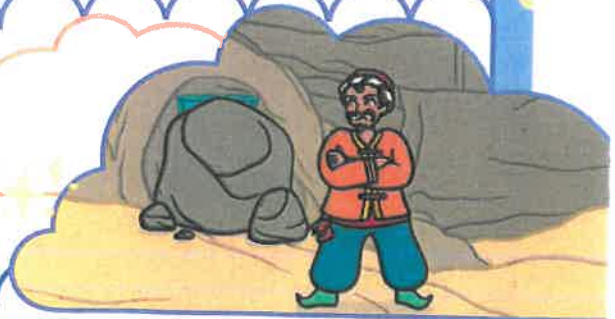
He wanted Aladdin to go inside a cave to find a lamp.



Aladdin found the lamp and a ring. He did not give the lamp to the magician.



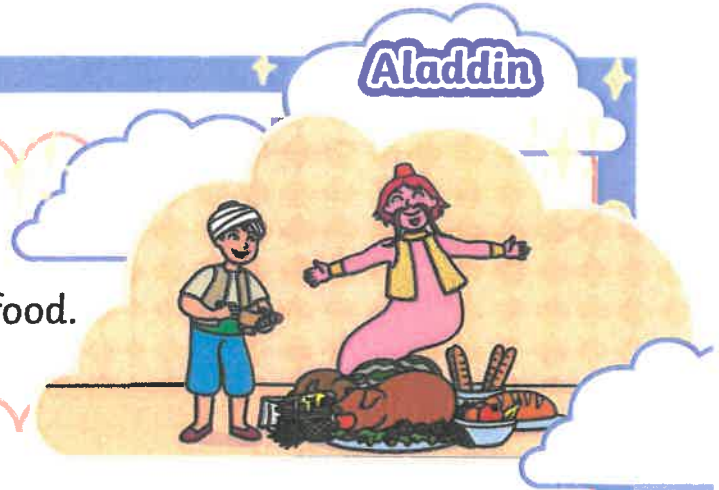
The cross magician blocked the cave.
