- 18 1. Firstly, the seeds of the cacao tree form in fruits called pods.
- 31 2. Next, workers cut the pods from the trees and remove the seeds and pulp by hand.
- 48 3. The seeds are left for a few days to develop their flavour before being dried. The dry seeds are also known as cocoa beans.
- 69 4. Then, the beans are roasted and the hard shells are removed.
- 83 5. After that, the beans are ground into a paste and sugar is added to create a sweeter taste.
- 100 6. The chocolate is then slowly heated and cooled to create a glossy finish.
- 112 7. Finally, the mixture is poured into a mould for the chocolate to set.
